## The Secretary-General's Message for Memorial to Fallen United Nations Peacekeepers 29 May 2009

The United Nations was established in 1945 to "save succeeding generations from the scourge of war". For more than 60 years, the men and women serving in UN peacekeeping have personified this noble goal. In the face of enormous security challenges and many other serious risks to their personal safety, they have shown outstanding dedication.

In 2008, 132 United Nations peacekeepers – military, police and civilians – lost their lives while serving under the blue flag in hotspots around the world. That number marks a terrible milestone: the highest one-year total in the history of UN peacekeeping. Whether felled by acts of violence, disease or accidents, these peacekeepers, including ten women, all left an inspiring legacy. Each also left behind families and friends grieving over their irreplaceable loved ones. It is with them that our deepest sympathies reside.

The UN peacekeeping family continues to grow, with more than 113,000 personnel deployed, including more than 90,000 troops and police contributed by 118 countries. Now more than ever, we must do our utmost to protect them.

Our fallen colleagues are especially cherished members of this family. We should be proud of their achievements, and determined to pay meaningful tribute to their sacrifice. They have not only helped populations in dire need, they have also honoured their countries and the United Nations. Their service will remain a source of hope and inspiration to all of us who carry on their lifesaving work for peace.
